Stella Maris is the largest ship-visiting network in the world.

They improve the lives of seafarers and fishers through their network of local chaplains and seafarer centres, expert information, advocacy, and spiritual support. Cases of seafarers abandoned by shipowners without money, support, the means to get home or even food and medical care have reached alarming levels around the world. In just 10 years known cases have soared from no more than a dozen a year to 143 in 2023 and already more than a hundred in 2024.

The seafarers who are working on vessels travelling to Ukraine via the Red then the Black Sea, navigating Houthi and Russian military threats as they sail through two major conflict zones. Stella Maris is one of the few seafarer charities with chaplains based in Ukraine, carrying out ship visits from the southern port city of Odesa. Here they work with seafarers on the frontline, witnessing the impact it is having on them.
